


Our Mission

- In South Africa, boxes of Easter eggs, which symbolize new life are collected and distributed to children in underprivileged schools.
- In Ethiopia, after Easter Mass, celebrants partake in dances and delicious meals. Both Christians and non-Christians come together to enjoy roasted chicken, goat, and rice dishes.
- In Ghana, Easter is synonymous with paragliding, which takes place on the Kwahu mountains in the Eastern region. Dozens of Ghanaians and tourists travel to the region to celebrate the festivities.

New Hospital Beds!

"Thank you for the support you have given us to purchase health unit beds and mattresses," writes Sr. Fausta Kyamagusha. Sr. Fausta had written asking for help for the St. Lucia Health Unit in Kagamba, Uganda. "We faced a significant challenge with our old beds -- which were wooden with wire springs that were often broken or in need of repair. Needless to say these were neither supportive nor comfortable for our patients. But thanks to your generous support, we were able to purchase new metal beds, mattresses and pillows."

The St. Lucia Health Unit, where Sr. Fausta works, was founded by a group of Missionary Sisters more than 20 years ago for those in the most remote regions of the country. "People were dying on their way to get medical care because it was so far away," Sr. Fausta explained in her initial letter to us. "The people needed our help -- so we founded a health unit in Kagamba. Now, thanks to you, we have 20 new adult beds and five new beds for children. The patients also used to roll their clothes up in a ball to use as a pillow. Now, we have new pillows for them as well. Thank you so very much!"

Now, thanks to your generosity, young people throughout the community are getting the training they need to develop critical job skills

"We needed tables, sewing machines, and an assortment of materials," Sr. Nathalie Lubungu writes. "Thanks to you, we have been able to purchase what was needed and to expand the training program to accommodate more students. Young people are now using the sewing machines and other equipment to become skilled enough to provide for themselves and their families. We are incredibly grateful to you."

Charitable IRA Rollover

What is a Charitable IRA Rollover?

• Charitable IRA Rollover is a permanent provision in the U.S. tax code for donors age 70½ or older to make a tax-wise gift to non-profit organizations, including the *Missionaries of Africa*.

Benefits of Charitable IRA Rollovers

- Satisfies requirements for annual minimum IRA withdrawals.
- Avoids federal and in some cases, state income tax.*
- Provides vital and ongoing support to the Missionaries and their missions in Africa.

Guidelines

- Donors age 70½ or older at the time of distribution.
- Gifts must be transferred directly from your IRA account to the *Missionaries of Africa*.
- Charitable gifts up to \$100,000 can be given each year.

How to make a Charitable Gift?

 Donors should contact their IRA Bank or broker/administrator to request an IRA distribution transfer to the *Missionaries of Africa*. Instruct your administrator to issue a check to the
