

A Message to the *Missionaries of Africa* from Pope Francis

"For this General Chapter, you have chosen to work on *mission as prophetic witness* I want to tell you that I was very pleased to hear that you have lived these days "with gratitude" and "with hope." This is beautiful. Looking at the past with gratitude is a sign of good spiritual health; it is the *deuteronomic* attitude that God taught his people (cf. *Dt* 8), cultivating grateful remembrance of the journey the Lord has had us take. And this gratitude is what nurtures the flame of hope. Someone who does not thank God for the gifts he has sown along the way — albeit tiring and at times painful — does not even have a hopeful heart, open to the surprises of God and trusting in his providence. In particular, this spiritual attitude is decisive to allow to mature the seedlings of the vocation that the Lord inspires with his Spirit and his Word. A community



in which one knows how to say "thank you" to God and to one's brothers, and in which one helps the other to hope in the Risen Lord, is a community that attracts and sustains those who are called to it. A special letter from our President

Summer 2022

Dear Friends,

In May-June this year, a few dozen delegates of the *Missionaries of Africa* met in Rome for our General Chapter. This gathering that takes place every six years represents a unique and spirit-filled moment in the life of our Society. It is always a time of intense prayer and dialogue to deepen our charism and discern the signs of the times for a mission oriented toward the needs and aspirations of God's people.

In light of the world's unprecedented crisis aggravated by an aggregation of factors like the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, the effects of global warming, the impact of the Russia-Ukraine geo-strategic war, and the galloping inflation affecting consumer prices, Africa, more than ever, is at the crossroads and dramatically affected. As a result, many communities and households have found themselves in precarious situations.

Economies are collapsing, and the likelihood of direct brutal clashes between farmers and herders for water resources has heightened by the day. Besides the burden of existing protracted conflicts, the rise of violent extremism



and terrorism in West Africa and North Africa continue to exact untold sufferings on vulnerable civilians. The East, the Horn of Africa, and the Great Lakes regions hosted nearly five million refugees at the end of 2021, twenty percent of the global refugee population. In addition, conflict in the Tigray region in Ethiopia led to the internal displacement of more than three million Ethiopians by the end of 2021.

All this provides context to the challenges of the Church's mission of evangelization, reconciliation, and care in Africa. It calls for solidarity to respond to the urgent needs of the most affected communities. However, there is a need for a long-term strategy to address the structural causes of a system that keeps a continent endowed with abundant natural resources in abject poverty. I hope you will be part of that great dream to offer disadvantaged people better opportunities to build a life of respect and dignity.

• Donors age 70 1/2 or older can transfer a contribution each year directly from a traditional IRA account. This may satisfy a portion or all of the annual required minimum distribution (RMD) and serve as a qualified charitable distribution for your IRA, which can decrease your tax burden even if you are no longer itemizing deductions.
